# Director's Notes

So, I don't know about you, but I am more than ready to bid adieu to the year 2020. There is not much good to say about the year as a deadly pandemic is causing pain and heartache as it ravages our country. Our failure to deal with the pandemic in a proper way has led to a new surge of infection in our country. Our economy has tanked and millions of people are suffering from the virus and its effects, which includes millions of jobs lost, people losing their homes, cars and anything of value. I'm



done with it!!

ALT went almost nine months without producing a show at the MainStage. Isn't that incredible? Never during my life in the theatre, which dates all the way back to High School, have I gone without producing theatre for that long. It made my heart hurt and caused me a lot of depression and anxiety.

ALT employees a staff of eight full time professionals, including myself. One of my goals throughout this mess has been to keep all of our staff employed. Thanks to a PPP grant from our government, we have kept everyone on staff. That makes me happy. I think it also typifies how well ALT treats everyone from our staff and board to our volunteers and patrons. We have approved an operating budget for the 2020-21 season which has a deficit bottom line of \$160,000. Our expenses and overhead stay pretty much the same, whether we are producing theatre or not. Unfortunately, our ticket sales, season tickets, playbill advertising revenue and Academy tuition is all down significantly.

Despite this serious cash shortage, I am proud to say that we can weather this storm for maybe two years because we have been very successful for a number of years, and we have been good stewards of our resources. As a result, we have a fairly significant amount of savings that will help us bridge that stunning deficit.

We have successfully produced three shows this season, including **The Humans** at the Adventure Space, the Academy production of The Ten (Thousand) Problems of a Teenage Girl and the recent production of The Curious Incident of the Dog in the **Night-Time**. We encountered Covid related problems during the rehearsals of each of those shows, but we got them on the stage and showed that we could establish strong safety protocols that would keep our patrons safe. We are forging ahead, because I honestly believe that we will probably just have to figure out how to live our lives with this virus always present.

This issue of Curtain Call announces the opening of *Winter Wonderettes*. This show was chosen to replace Matilda on our schedule as I concluded that the *Matilda* cast was too large to keep everyone safe. I think you are going to love *Winter Wonderettes*! It is fun, light-hearted and it features some amazing ALT talent. I hope you will plan to see it.
