From the same author as ALT's fan favorite **Baskerville**, this popular mystery adaptation of Agatha Christie's suspenseful masterpiece comes to life in this stylish production.

All aboard! The exotic Orient Express is hurtling down the tracks...to a murder! **Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express** is a plot-twist masterpiece that has thrilled mystery lovers from television, radio, and film. Audiences now have the chance to experience this lush comedy live onstage. The famous novel is widely regarded as one of Agatha Christie's greatest literary achievements. First published in 1934, the stylish, suspenseful murder mystery about an unlikely cast of potential suspects - including a colonel, a princess and a countess, all with alibis – trapped aboard the luxurious Orient Express during a snowstorm features one of the most iconic fictional detectives of all time – Belgian private detective Hercule Poirot. Just after midnight, a snowdrift stops the Orient Express in its tracks. The luxurious train is surprisingly full for the time of the year, but by the morning it is one passenger fewer. An American tycoon lies dead in his compartment, stabbed multiple times, his door locked from the inside. Isolated and with a killer in their midst, the passengers rely on detective Hercule Poirot to identify the murderer – in case he or she decides to strike again.

ALT has assembled a talented array of suspects for this production mixed with ALT veterans and newcomers. Performers include **Michael Newman** as renowned detective Hercule Poirot, **Rob Attaway** as Michel the Conductor, **Brooks Boyett** as Samuel Ratchett, **Mallory Corona** as Mary Debenham, **Jax Ebert** as Hector MacQueen, **Jeremy Hernandez** as the Head Waiter, **Carrie Huckabay** as Helen Hubbard, **Jenny Morgan** as Greta Ohlsson, **Sarah Olson** as Countess Andrenyi, **Sean Reneau** as Colonel Arbuthnot, **Melanie Sanders** as Princess Dragomiroff and **Michael Stafford** as Monsieur Bouc. Understudies for the production include **Kendall Carnahan**, **Jackie Llewellyn** and **Jeffrey Pickens**. Artistic Director for this production is **Jason Crespin** with **Ryce Garren** serving as Assistant Director and **Dennis Humphrey** and **Blake Nester** as Production Assistants. Scenic designer for this play is **Tana Roberson**.

Happy December to you all! I hope your holiday celebrations have been lovely and continue to bring joy to you and your friends and family. Here at the Academy, we are celebrating a wonderful semester that has come to a close and the promise of a new, exciting semester beginning very soon.



The beginning of our 2021-22 Academy season brought the much anticipated production of **Newsies** to audiences. The cast of 41 students, instructors, and alumni filled the stage with bright energy and incredible skill, making this show unforgettable. Soon after closing *Newsies*, area high schoolers attended our final camp for the Summer and presented a hauntingly beautiful showcase production of *The Miraculous* Journey of Edward Tulane. We introduced four new classes in our Fall schedule including two for adults. I am proud to say they all ended their semesters thriving, and three will be returning in the Spring. October brought the classic stories of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle to our stage in **Sherlock Holmes and the First Baker** Street Irregular. 35 Academy students, including several first-timers, brought heart and humor to Doyle's classic mysteries, and made my first play to direct truly special. Finally, after show choir gigs, mock dance auditions, the study of Greek theatre, and so much more, our Academy classes ended at the beginning of December with brilliant showcases and fantastic final classes.

Looking ahead to the second half of our season, Academy students have just as many wonderful opportunities to learn and perform, if not more. The beginning of the year brings us the Academy's first Winter Theatre Camp. Students in K-4th grades will learn about music, costume and set design, and the basics of theatre while also rehearsing for their end of camp showcase. This camp will run the third week of AISD's winter break, Monday, January 3rd – Friday, January 7th. Classes start back strong two weeks later as we prepare for recitals, competitions, and more showcases and gigs. Also in January are auditions for our Spring musical, **Tuck Everlasting**. Audition information can be found in the **Tuck Everlasting** Audition Packet on the Academy's website. Remember, only enrolled Academy students may audition, so ensure your students are signed up for their favorite classes now since auditions happen before the first day of class.

I remind you of everything we have accomplished and plan to accomplish because I would also like to remind you that the Academy would not experience this level of success without the help of its incredible volunteers and sponsors. If you are someone who has given your time or monetarily, I personally thank you so much. The Academy instructors and I get to see first-hand the difference you have made and continue to make with your giving. I promise you, every little bit helps.

Finally, I will remind you one last time to register for classes. Even if a student was enrolled in the Fall, that does not guarantee a spot in the Spring.
