# Characters

- Catherine Donohue: (Female presenting) Mid to late 20s. A young wife and mother of two. She works at the Radium Dial Company. While she is quiet, sensitive and reflective at times, she is by no means weak. She is full of life and passion for her work, her friends, and her husband.
- Frances: (Female presenting) Mid to late 20s. A worker at the factory. She is the 'moral backbone' of the group, but is more flexible than she lets on. She acts as a mediator during the beginning of the show between Charlotte and Catherine. (May also play Reporter 2, an Official)
- Charlotte: (Female presenting) Mid to late 20s. A worker at the factory. She is outspoken and hard-boiled. She is competitive and has a biting sense of humor. Underneath this front, however, she is just as kind hearted as her friends. (May also play Reporter 1)
- Pearl: (Female presenting) Mid to late 20s. A worker alongside Catherine at the factory. Sweet and supportive she is the "joker of the group." But Pearl has a hard time coming to terms with her developing illness. (May also play Daughter, Judge 2)
- Tom Donohue: (Male presenting) Mid to late 20s. The husband of Catherine Donohue, a riveter on the skyscrapers of Chicago. He loves Catherine and is extremely devoted to her, but is somewhat unsettled when his wife starts making more money than he does. (May also play Dr. Rowntree, Dr. Dalitsch)
- Mr. Reed: (Male presenting) 30s-50s. The overseer of the factory. His heart is
  usually with the girls, but when put under pressure he is a pawn of the Radium
  Dial Company and has to follow orders. (May also play Radio Announcer,
  Company Doctor, Son, Judge, Leonard Grossman.
- The director may cast ensemble member(s) to play the additional roles listed above in the character descriptions.

All characters are open to actors of any ethnicity. Ages and genders indicated are how the characters will be perceived, not necessarily the age/gender of the actors.

## Audition Instructions

### **FORMS**

### **AUDITIONS**

Auditions will consist of readings from the script sides. Sides will be provided by the director once the auditions start .

### **CALLBACKS**

After auditions have concluded, the director will determine who is needed for callbacks. Callbacks will be by director invitation only. A callback list will be posted on ALT's homepage at Noon on Sunday, 1/8/23. The director will also notify anyone who auditions on January 8 if they need to stay for that nights callback.

### MASKS/COVID PROTOCOL

At this time, masks are not enforced during rehearsals or performances. However, ALT and the Directors have total discretion if the climate changes with regards to COVID during the timeline of this show. - Bullying or taking unfair advantage of another participant
- · Failing to cooperate with ALT Staff, Board Members, or others in leadership
- Engaging in conduct detrimental to the organization, subversive conduct, or actions which undermine the organization
